## LEADERSHIP TRAINING

SEUT's main course continues to be the **Degree in Theology**, for which 115 students are currently registered. In July we celebrated students' studies at the annual Graduation ceremony (photo) in the seminary grounds.

Good progress towards offering all our courses online via *CiberSEUT* was made during 2008; we expect the project to be completed by the end of this academic year. Then there will be ongoing improvements so that the seminary becomes a model of good practice.

Regarding the struggle for official recognition by the Spanish state, some advance has been noticeable, but we await further news from the authorities.

A **Masters' Degree** has been planned, and further preliminary work is currently underway.



## TRAINING FOR LOCAL CHURCHES

SEUT aims to provide high quality training not only for church leaders, but for all Christian people. The **Taller Teológico (Theological Workshop)** was started in 2007 specifically to meet this need. Under the direction of Osmundo Ponce, assisted by Marita Sörgel and several associate lecturers, the programme has grown significantly.



First, a number of workbooks have been published (e.g. Pedro Zamora's *Do you understand what you are reading?* and Dionisio Byler's *Speaking about God from the Bible*) and more are being prepared.

Second, 185 students in 23 church based groups are studying the courses; several groups have already progressed to the second module.

Finally, there have been 119 participants in the series of day conferences organized by the **Taller Teológico** (photo). More information about this exciting and strategic project is available (in Spanish) at [www.tallerteologico.es](http://www.tallerteologico.es)

With the return of Dr Pablo de Felipe to Spain after a period of research in Scotland, 2008 also witnessed important developments at the seminary's **Centre for Science and Faith**. This project aims to help Christians relate two areas of life often thought to be in conflict. ## RESIDENCE

## RETREAT CENTRE



Part of the vision for SEUT is that it should become a centre for spiritual as well as academic formation. An important development during 2008 was the work to restore *La Chimenea* ('The Chimney') as the seminary's chapel.

Further work on the building and surrounding grounds is dependent upon funding.

## LIBRARY

At the end of the year the library boasted 15,298 volumes, nearly 200 more than in January.

We are very grateful to those supporters who have donated books to the library holdings.

After a number of years in abeyance the *Biblioteca Protestante* has restarted, allowing searches of all the Protestant libraries in Madrid from a single website.

## CONFERENCES AND PUBLICATIONS

SEUT's lecturers have continued to publish widely during the year.

Apart from articles in the *Separata to Cristianismo Protestante* and the seminary's journal, *Encuentro* ('Encounter'), more academic articles have been published in the fields of theology, philosophy, biblical studies and mission.

Dissemination of learning has not been restricted to the printed and electronic word, but has also occurred in many seminars and conferences, both here in Spain and internationally.

And, of course, all SEUT's lecturers have weekly teaching and preaching commitments in their churches.

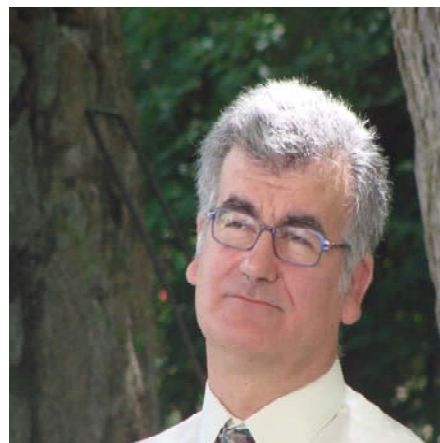
## STAFF NEWS
